Maine Families Systems Coordinator

Maine Children's Trust is a statewide organization based in Augusta that prioritizes family and child well-being. We believe that supportive communities and strong families prevent child abuse and neglect. For nearly 30 years, we have lead child abuse prevention efforts in Maine and are looking for a dedicated family services professional who brings expertise, technical skill, and passion that will enhance, support, and drive future efforts for programming all over the state.

Overview:

Maine Children's Trust is seeking a highly competent project administrator with skills and experience in managing family services programming to serve as part of the management team of the Maine Families Home Visiting Program. This position reports to the Executive Director. The major focus of this position will be to work with early childhood system and state agency partners on joint efforts to strengthen a statewide collaborative system of supports for young children and their families. The Systems Coordinator will provide planning and operational management support. Additional responsibilities will include grant management duties, federal grant preparation and reporting, and assistance with a variety of program related management tasks and projects.

Requirements:

- Proven experience in human services program/project management
- Familiarity with federal grants management
- Knowledge of early childhood and human services programming
- Ability to work effectively independently and as part of a team
- Ability to plan, coordinate, implement and manage multiple activities at once
- Ability to effectively convene and lead teams, coalitions and working groups
- Ability to evaluate and apply data to quality assurance and improvement strategies
- Availability to work during typical business hours
- Ability and willingness to travel in state, with out of state travel also required occasionally
- Outstanding verbal and written communication skills

The ideal candidate will have strong organizational skills to manage diverse responsibilities, proven experience in program management using data driven practice, strong collaboration skills, outstanding verbal and written communication skills and a MA/MS in human development, public health, social work, family services or other relevant area. This position is a full-time salaried grant-funded position based in Augusta and comes with some opportunity to work remotely. The salary band range for this position type is \$68,835-\$79,425.
